I had found a list of children on worldconnect for Newbold J and Elizabeth, that began with Eunice Amanthus Cannon, and I assumed that was all the children they had. When we were in Missouri in May 2008, talking to George Hoffman, descendant of John B. Cannon, brother of Newbold J. Cannon, he suggested that there were at least two other NJ Cannon daughters, specifically Frances, who married William M. Legg, and Martha, who married a Morrison. He based this on the heirs listed on Newbold's probate papers. William M. Legg, in fact, is made his executor. I suggested that perhaps there is another daughter, one who would be the mother of Mary Thomas, who is listed on the 1860 census with Newbold J and Elizabeth. Because there are no names listed on the 1840 census, and the 1850 census for the family is missing, all we have to go on is the list of heirs, and marriage certificates for Frances, Martha and Mary Ann. Adding these women to the list would make sense with the information on the 1840 census, also. I feel these three women should be included in the list of children.

Apparently NJ died without a will. An Administrator's Bond was created October 23, 1866. In this document, William M. Legg, as 'Principal,' is directed to settle the affairs of Newbold J. Cannon.

"William M. Legg, administrator of the Estate of Newbold J. Cannon, deceased, being duly sworn, says that the said N.J. Cannon died intestate, and without leaving any will, at Lewis Co. Sep. A.D. 1866, leaving as his heirs, Elizabeth Ann wife of Decd Amanthus Herald Frances Legg William Cannon Charles Cannon Elizabeth Cannon in Lewis County Missouri & John Cannon Luther Cannon Illinois & Martha Morrison in Omahaw City."

NJ died in 1866; Elizabeth (called Betsy on some documents), Elizabeth (Lizzie) the daughter, and Charles are on the 1870 census with James Chewning in Clark Cunty, MO. James Chewning, Moses' brother, is listed as single. Betsy 'keeps house.' The next census entry is for Moses Chewning, who lives with a family as a farm laborer.

The question is: what is the connection between the Chewnings and the Cannons that would have created this situation? Betsy Beckner Cannon is a widow, she has moved from where she has lived for several decades, in Lewis County, and has taken a position as housekeeper. Her eldest daughter, Eunice Amanthus Cannon Harrel (and her husband and two children) had been living with NJ and Elizabeth on the 1860 census. By 1870, NJ has died, Elizabeth (Betsy) and two children have moved in with the Chewnings. The other Cannon sons, William, Martin Luther (he went by Luther, apparently), and John, are also out of the area on the 1870 census. Both Martin and John have married Reese/Reece women in Warren County, IL, and are living in Monmouth in 1870. There are some mysteries here. Charles would soon follow.

What caused Luther and John to leave Missouri between 1860 and 1870? Whether the death of NJ Cannon in 1866 was the reason the sons moved to Illinois or not, I don't know, although I now know that Luther was in Monmouth by 1863, so his father's death wasn't the reason. Why Monmouth? They may have been aware that their cousins, George W., Henry C., and Johanna Beckner VanKirk, had moved there in 1851. George W. and Johanna were the son and daughter of their mother's brother, Abraham L. Beckner. See the section in the Beckner genealogy about George W. Beckner. Some of that information is included at this end of this narrative.

Elizabeth (Lizzie) remained in Clark County, MO, the rest of her life. She married Moses Chewning, her neighbor on the 1870 census, brother of the Chewning with whom she and her mother and brother were living in 1870.

Two of her children, Theodore and Spencer, would also move to Monmouth.

Nita Chewning confirmed our suspicions that Mary Ann Cannon was indeed the daughter of NJ and Elizabeth. In an email she sent me 6/23/2008, she says that Mary Ann Cannon was the eldest of the children:

I got the information today that MARY ANN CANNON was NEWBOLD CANNON Jr. eldest daughter, on the 1840 census she is being listed as being between 5 and 10. She died in MO. a few months after her daughter Mary Elizabeth Thomas was born, from the story that Jim Chewning's wife was told by her mother or grandmother in law. Mary Ann Cannon/Thomas's husband left the baby with his in laws and went to the gold country he was never heard from again. He was found on a CA. census married to another Mary who was born in AR. about 4 years or so before Mary Anno Cannon was born. Do not know this Mary's maiden name yet. When my friend finds the information, (she may have left it in WA.) where her home is. She called me from Montana today and we talked of this. She is to send me the rest of the information as soon as she gets it. She said that she may have it in Montana, but will have to look through her genealogy material.

and this:

From an email from Nita Chewning: Pam, I found this note in the files for Mary Ann Cannon. I don't have the address for this lady but will try to find her next time I go to OK.

"Nita,

I am enclosing the attachment again. Hope you can get it. If you don't I will send you what it has on it. The other family is Newbold and Elizabeth's daughter Unise Amanthus, her husband, Ephraim and their children. This is <u>my husband's great grandparents.</u>

We live in Oklahoma and she is buried about 12 miles from our house. In 1880, they are in McDonald County, Missouri and then they came to Oklahoma.

Martin and John Cannon both were in Illinois and married in 1870. Ephraim and Unise were still in Lewis County.

If this is correct, and Mary Ann was between 5 and 10 on that census, she was born between 1830 and 1835.

There is no slave schedule for the family.

Did Mary Ann d. between 1850 and 1860?

There is no census record in Lewis County, MO, for Benjamin and Mary Ann Cannon Thomas in 1860.

That year, there is a Mary Thomas, 10, living with Newbold J and Elizabeth Cannon. It would seem that Mary Thomas was the daughter of Mary Ann Cannon Thomas, and that perhaps Mary Ann has died. As Nita said above, she thinks that Benjamin moved to California and remarried. In the note from Nita below, she mentions Mary A. Fetters, but I think it is Mary *Elizabeth* Thomas that marries first a Fetters, then James Madison Chewning.

There is a marriage cert for a Benjamin T. Thomas in 1855, which would perhaps be Benjamin, already widowed, and living in CA, having left his daughter to be raised by his in-laws.


Further, when NJ dies in 1866 and his probate records list his heirs, there is no mention of any Thomas. I believe records show that this is because his daughter Mary Ann Cannon Thomas had preceded him in death.

There is a Benjamin Thomas on the 1860 census, b. in 1825, in MO, living in Tulare County, CA, with wife Mary, b. in 1836, in AR, sons Charles, 4, and Joseph, 2, b. in CA. Could be.

There's a Mary E. Thomas on an 1870 census in Santa Barbara County, MO, b. in AR in 1838, widow, with children Charles, 14, b. in CA, son Joseph, 11, b. in CA, dau. Sarah, 10, b. in CA, son Wm M., 5, b. in CA. Could be 2nd wife of Benjamin Thomas.

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Keith Owen's tree shows that John Fetters d. 3/3/1874. There is a FAG memorial for a John Fetters in Saint Patrick's Cemetery, Saint Patrick, Clark, MO. Could very well be him.

So Mary is left a widow at 25 or so, with two little children.

Mary first married John Fetters, had a least two children (John Fetters, and Mary Ann Fetters), was widowed, then married James Chewning. Therefore, she and her aunt Elizabeth (Lizzie) married Chewning brothers.

According to the tombstone information above, and the fact that they lost 4 children, 3 of those 4 could be Viola, Oscar L., and Emma C., all of whose tombstones say they died prior to 1900.

Nita's information says that Jane Viola and Emma both died of snakebite (Jane Viola in June 1890, Emma in May 1900). The obit above says Emma died of typhoid fever.

James died in 1906.

On the **Civil War Veterans index**, his widow is listed, Mary Chewning. He was in the A & N, 2 Pro. En. Mo. Mil. From what I understand, that means the Provisional Missouri Enlisted Militia. On July 29, 1892, he is listed as an invalid, and on May 1, 1906, the classification is 'widow.'

On the **Special Schedule, Surviving Soldiers, Sailors and Marines and Widows, Etc., 1890 Widows Pension list**, he is listed as Private, company A, 69th Regiment, MO Infantry, May? 1862 – Oct. 1864, 2 years, 6 months, 0 days. Chronic bronchitis






Union Twp., Clark County, MO 1915 plat map.2

Their records show birth: 23 Mar 1832. Death: 11 Jan 1908. They also show in the papers her first name as "Eunice."*

Tressa Selby

In 2008, I was corresponding with Tressa Selby, whose husband was a great grandson of Eunice and Ephraim.

Ephraim and Eunice, son Herbert Bonis Harrel married Eva Lue Stacey. Their daughter, Anna Annie Harrel married Oscar David Selby. Their son, Darrel Richard Pete Selby married Tressa.

This is a portion of an email dated 7/23/2008:

She (Eunice) died in 1908 in Oklahoma and he died somewhere around 1883 in either Missouri or Kansas. Pete's (my husband) great uncle Robert Harrel told him that he was about 15 when his dad went to collect some money owed to him and the man shot and killed him.

...Does anyone have photos of the Cannons? We don't have any. Unise lived with another son's family about 15 miles from us and we don't have any.

Another email, dated 7/24/2008, also included information that Ephraim may have been shot. She also had been told that James, perhaps, died in an industrial accident, which was erroneous. It seems that he died of an illness, per newspaper articles of that time.

My husbands great grandmother was Unise Amanthus Cannon. She married Ephraim Harrel. They had the Bible. It passed to their son, Robert Lee and then to my husand's mother, Robert Lee's niece. He did not marry or have any children and lived with them the last few years of his life. My sister in law has the Bible. It is in pretty bad shape, that's why I took photos of the pages.

The list of slave birthdates are the children of the slaves of Newbold Sr. The ones he left to his daughters in his will. I do not have the will of Newbold Jr. I have not been to Lewis County. I live in Avant, Oklahoma. It is about 28 miles northwest of Tulsa, OK. Unise is buried about 12 miles from where we live. Two of her children came to this area and pretty well stayed here.









- Has a son named Martin, and a grandson Martin Luther, as his brother was named
- Daughter, Betsy A., marked Davis. Betsy A. would have been William's mother's name
- Mary Willie Cannon was b. in MO 1/27/1870, so he was still in the state at that time. By 1873 in TX, based on the birth year given for Ida J. Cannon.

We know that William Madison Legg, widow of Frances Cannon Legg, moved to TX (I believe via MS) after Frances' death in 1870. It's possible that William went with him, married and raised his family in Texas. The Legg's eventually moved to KS.





Martin Luther, and his brother John moved to Monmouth, Warren, IL, sometime after 1862, and before Martin Luther married in 1865. NJ's list of heirs in 1866, also says that Martin Luther and John are in Illinois.

I found that Martin Luther registered for the Civil War draft from Lenox Twp., Warren County, IL, 7/25/1863, so he was in IL sometime after he signed an oath of loyalty in MO in 1862, and his registration in IL in 1863.
