John moved to Monmouth during the 1860's, as did his brother, Martin Luther Cannon. Martin Luther registered for the Civil War in 1863 from Lenox, Warren, IL. Don't know if John was with him at that point or not.

Apparently NJ died without a will. An Administrator's Bond was created Oct. 23, 1866. In this document, William M. Legg, as 'Principal,' is directed to settle the affairs of Newbold J. Cannon.

*"William M. Legg, administrator of the Estate of Newbold J. Cannon, deceased, being duly sworn, says that the said N.J. Cannon died intestate, and without leaving any will, at Lewis Co. Sep. A.D. 1866, leaving as his heirs, Elizabeth Ann wife of Decd Amanthus Herald Frances Legg William Cannon Charles Cannon Elizabeth Cannon in Lewis County Missouri & John Cannon Luther Cannon Illinois & Martha Morrison in Omahaw City."*

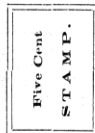

Published: Chicago, H. F. Ket & Co., Cor. 5th Ave. and Washington St., 1877

*The United Presbyterian Church of Spring Grove was organized June 22, 1855, by Rev. Matthew Bigger of the Presbytery of Monmouth, with fifty-one members. The first pastor was Rev. James C. McKnight, who was ordained June 11, 1856, and remained over four years. Rev. Wm. Graham was next pastor and continued this relation until his death, in the Fall of 1863. Rev. Thomas P. Patterson was ordained Oct. 27, 1864, and was pastor until April, 1868, and continued his work for five years. The present pastor is the Rev. Rufus Johnson, who began June 15, 1876. The present number of members is about seventy. This congregation own a large house of worship costing about \$4,000 and a good parsonage with three acres of ground.*

The Church of God is located in southeast quarter of Sec. 10, Spring Grove township. It was organized in 1865 by Rev. Rudolph White, and the earliest meetings were held in the school house in district No. 4. Among the original members were Jehu Bailey and wife, D.C. Swiller, wife and three children, **John Cannon and wife**, and others. The

church was built in 1867 and cost \$1,600. The present pastor is Rev. Thos. DeShiria. Membership about twenty-five and Sabbath school the same; John Simcox, Superintendent.

Mary Cannon was tried in Judge Turnbull's court, Wednesday, for disturbing the peace. She conducted her own case claiming that she acted in self defense in firing a shot or two out of her window at a crowd of men trying to get into her house. A jury of six, A. L. Cable, Jonas Holgate, J. F. Guilinger, David Wilson, W. P. McClung and F. M. Davidson, heard the evidence and declared Mary innocent.

### John married in St. Louis

The information below is pretty shocking; John obviously committed bigamy once, **perhaps twice**.

The first woman was Carrie B. Cannon, who died 1/1898. I spent several hours trying to figure out who she saw. Her sister, an article says, was Hattie Starr, and the woman was Mrs. Belle Starr Howard.

I cannot find anyone who that could be in St. Louis, but I did find that a Marius Diard married a Catherine Starr. Diard does sound like Howard.

Furthermore, Mauris Diard' sister, Fatima Diard, was a famous opera singer, who sang with a woman named Hattie Starr. I think there is a connection here, but I can't find any marriage records for a Belle Starr Howard or Diard, or a Connie B. Cannon, as she is named in another article. If they married, the apparently didn't take out a license in the St. Louis area.

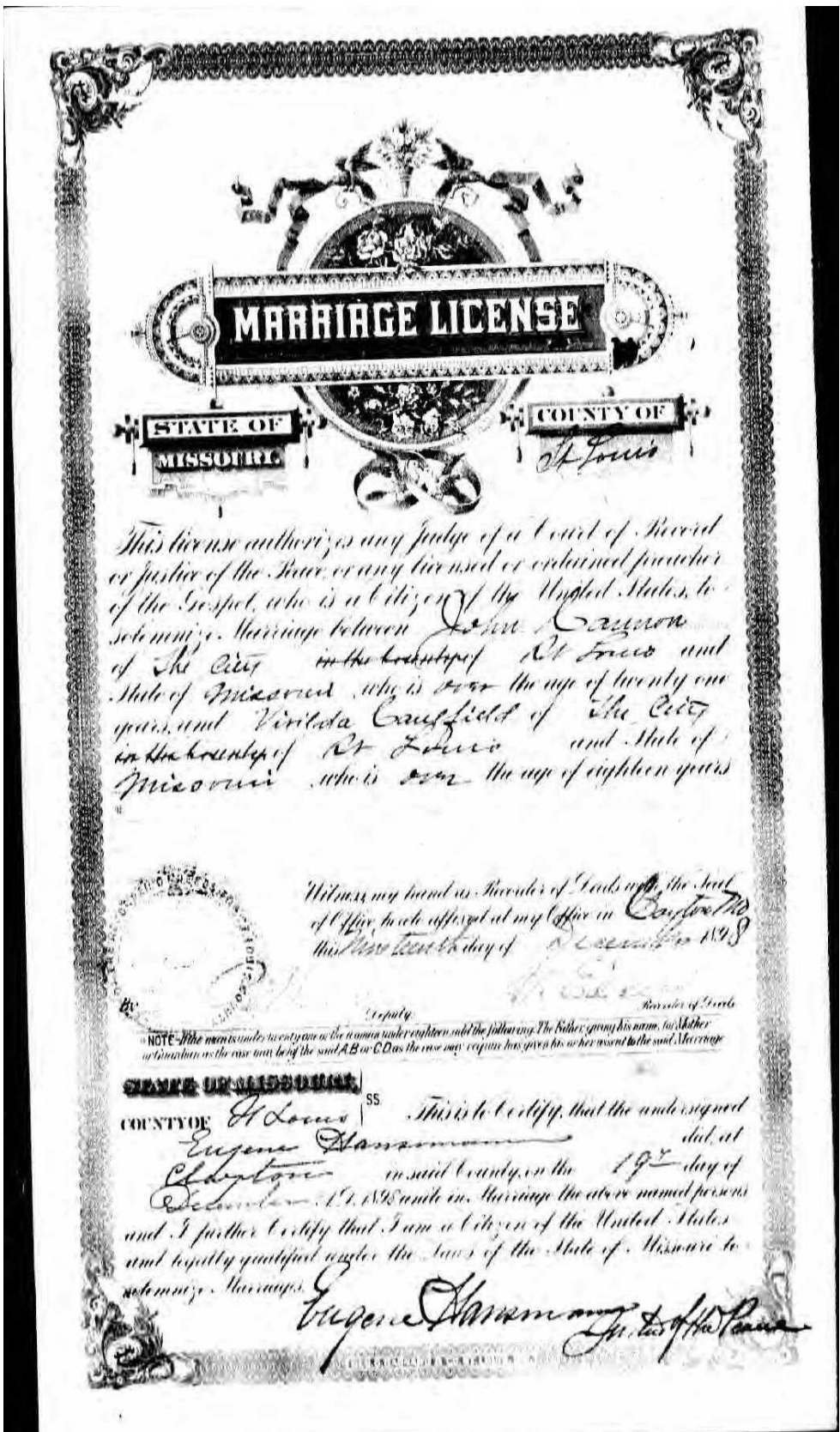
Also, I can't find a Connie B. Cannon or any other Cannon woman dying at the time John's 2<sup>nd</sup> wife was supposed to have died.

John then committed bigamy again, 12/1898. This woman, Virilda Milburn Caufield Cannon, found out 6 months after their marriage.

Virilda Milburn Caulfield was a midwife, and a widow. She was from St. Louis, and had a prominent son – a judge, I believe.

**JOHN CANNON DOESN'T KNOW HIS PREDICAMENT.**

**APPENDICITIS AND TWO WIVES.**

**His Latest Wife Has Sworn Out a Warrant for Bigamy and Charges His Son With Burglary.**

John Cannon, 50 years old, is in a most unenviable position. He is a patient at the Missouri Baptist Sanitarium, flat on his back unable to move. There is a deputy sheriff waiting in the ante-room to the sick chamber to arrest Cannon on a warrant for bigamy as soon as he is able to arise from his bed.

But this is not all. Cannon's son, Dean, is being sought by officers armed with a warrant charging the young man with burglary in the second degree and larceny. Worse, still, two women who claim to be Cannon's wives are alternately hammering on the door of the sick room—figuratively speaking.

Cannon has been married three times during his half century of existence. Other men have done the same thing but, Cannon, it is charged, neglected entirely to secure legal separation from Mrs. Cannon No. 1 when he led No. 2 to the altar. Fortunately for Mrs. Cannon No. 2 she died without discovering that she was second choice.

Unfortunately for Cannon, however, wife No. 3 is very much alive to the entire situation and proposes, so she says, to make Mr. Cannon unravel the tangle into which he has wooed her.

The denouement in this play of too much Mrs. Cannon came at the Baptist Sanitarium when wife No. 1 was denied admission to Cannon's room by wife No. 3, who was the widow of John Caulfield. Wife No. 1 told who she was and wife No. 3 was surprised and disturbed. Mrs. Caulfield-Cannon had been paying the bills at the Sanitarium. She quit paying and made inquiries.

Mrs. Caulfield was married to Cannon at Clayton, Dec. 19, 1898. It was an elopement.

Cannon told his wife that he had several children living at Monmouth, Ill., but did not desire that they should know of the marriage. Accordingly, secrecy was maintained. Cannon procured some furniture and put it into the house.

Several days ago Cannon became ill with appendicitis. His wife cared for him tenderly. On the advice of physicians, she had him removed to the Baptist Sanitarium. She employed a trained nurse to attend him. She spent most of her time by the bed. Cannon's condition became serious. His wife wrote to Dean Cannon, his son, whom she had never seen or communicated with before, asking that he come to his father. Dean came, and so did his mother. They went direct to the sanitarium. They were informed that Mrs. Cannon had given instructions to permit no one to enter the sick room. Just then Mrs. Cannon No. 3 appeared. Tableau!

Explanations and other things followed. Mrs. Caulfield-Cannon posted off to Clayton and swore out a warrant charging Cannon with bigamy. While she was gone, it is alleged, Dean Cannon removed the furniture from her house. When she returned and discovered the absence of her household effects she hastened to the Four Courts and swore out a warrant charging Dean Cannon with burglary. The warrants were issued Friday afternoon.

Cannon's health was greatly improved Saturday morning. He has not been informed of the war clouds that are hovering over him.

Mrs. Cannon No. 2, who was Mrs. Belle Starr Howard, is dead. Her sister, Miss Hattie Starr, lives at 2619 Pine street. Dean Cannon and his mother are living at 1811 Washington avenue.

## **MOVED FROM THE SANITARIUM.**

### **John Cannon Taken Away by His Son, Dean Cannon.**

John Cannon was removed late Saturday night by his son, Dean Cannon, from the Baptist Sanitarium, where he had been operated on for appendicitis. Young Cannon refused to tell Dr. Wilkes, Superintendent of the Sanitarium, where he intended to take his father. He only said he had discovered a quieter place.

Young Cannon has not appeared at his boarding house, at 1811 Washington avenue, since the removal, and it is supposed he is with his father.

Sheriff Pohlman's deputies have been working diligently to serve the warrant, charging bigamy, against the father, and the warrant, charging burglary and larceny in the second degree, against the son, but their efforts have not yet been rewarded.

## THE MONMOUTH RE

### Too Much Cannon.

Troubles are coming thick and fast to John Cannon, who formerly lived here. He left here and finally drifted to St. Louis about thirteen years ago, and on Dec. 19, 1898, married Mrs. John Cannon, of that city. They lived together until about two weeks ago, when Mr. Cannon was taken ill with appendicitis, and taken to the Missouri Baptist sanitarium. An operation was performed, and he was thought to be dying. At his request, his first wife, Mrs. Mary Cannon, and his children, Dean and Alice, of this city, were sent for by friends. When the last Mrs. Cannon heard that her predecessor had arrived at the hospital, she became very indignant and swore out a warrant, charging her husband with bigamy. Other complications arose over some furniture owned by Mr. Cannon, while living with another wife, in Canton, Ohio, some time ago. The goods were taken possession of and shipped to Monmouth by Dean Cannon.

On account of Mr. Cannon's precarious condition the warrant was not served on him. In the meantime Mr. Cannon was spirited away from the hospital, by his children, Dean and Alice, who say that he will be ready to appear at his trial when the time comes.

On his return to Monmouth Dean gave a very thrilling account of the way in which his father was removed from the hospital. Last Saturday evening, at nine o'clock, he and his sister went to the hospital and dressed their father, who was too weak to stand. Dean then picked his father up in his arms, and carried him down three flights of stairs and around the corner, to where a rubber tired cab was waiting for them. The daughter brought up the rear of the procession, armed with a revolver, to defend her father if they should be observed. However, everything was favorable to their plans, and Mr. Cannon was taken on board the train and safely installed in a hospital, no one knows where, except his son, who refuses to disclose his father's whereabouts.

# BIGAMY IS CHARGED.

POLICE ARE STILL SEARCHING  
FOR JOHN CANNON.

BELIEVED TO BE STILL ALIVE.

Wife No. 2 Filed Several Depositions  
at Clayton—She Thinks He Is at  
Monmouth or Chicago.

Two depositions filed in the Circuit Court at Clayton bring out a new phase of the disappearance of John Cannon while he was a patient at the Missouri Baptist Sanitarium, several weeks ago.

The depositions charge Cannon with being the husband of two wives and are filed in support of the suit of the second wife, Mrs. Virilda Caufield Cannon, for a divorce.

The circumstances surrounding Cannon's disappearance, which are revealed now for the first time, are peculiar.

It seems, according to the statement of wife No. 2, that while Cannon lay ill at the sanitarium she telegraphed to his children at Monmouth, Ill., of his condition. In response to the message, the children came, bringing with them a woman whom they called mother, and who, wife No. 2 became convinced, had a claim on Cannon.

Subsequent to this, Dean Cannon, a son, called at the Sanitarium. He carried his father out in his arms and put him in a carriage, which was driven rapidly away. Many supposed that he had died, but Attorney S. C. Rogers, who represents wife No. 2, believes he is either at Monmouth or with his daughters at Chicago.

One of the depositions is made by Circuit Clerk Tourtellat of Warren County, Ill., and the other is by Martin L. Cannon, brother of John Cannon.

The evidence in both shows that Cannon was married to his first wife, Mary Cannon, in 1867, and that she is still living at Monmouth. They know nothing of a divorce.

Attorney Rogers also has evidence that there was another wife between this first

and

and the one who now sues for divorce. She was Carrie B. Cannon. She died in January, 1898, and Cannon married Mrs. Virilda Caufield of St. Louis in June of the same year. Thus he stands accused of having twice committed bigamy, but death saved him from the consequences of one alleged offense.

When the last wife became cognizant of these alleged facts, she filed suit for divorce and procured two warrants against Cannon. One charges him with taking furniture, which she claims belonged to her, from a flat at 1517 Goode avenue, and the other charges him with bigamy. These warrants are in the hands of St. Louis and St. Louis County officers.

Another remarkable feature of the case is that two of Cannon's children, by the Monmouth wife, visited at the home where Cannon and wife No. 2 were living, remaining from April 1 to April 17. This is how Mrs. Cannon No. 2 learned that he had children. When Cannon became ill, it was natural that Mrs. Cannon No. 2 should notify them. She was wholly unprepared for the revelation that followed their coming with their mother.

Mrs. Cannon No. 2 lives in West Cabanne. Attorney Rogers says she is only anxious to procure a divorce from Cannon.

"These depositions," he said, "show conclusively that he has another wife living at Monmouth. My client first heard of it when the other wife came to see him when he was ill.

"I don't believe he is dead. He was taken from the Sanitarium by his son, Dean, and is either at Monmouth or with his son at Chicago.

Cannon has five children, ranging in age from 20 to 30. The oldest child, George, lives in Chicago. The others live at Monmouth, Ill.

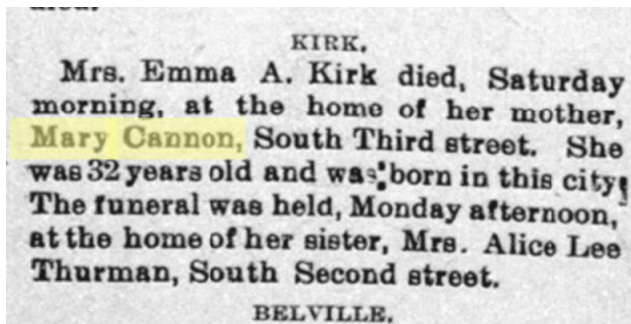

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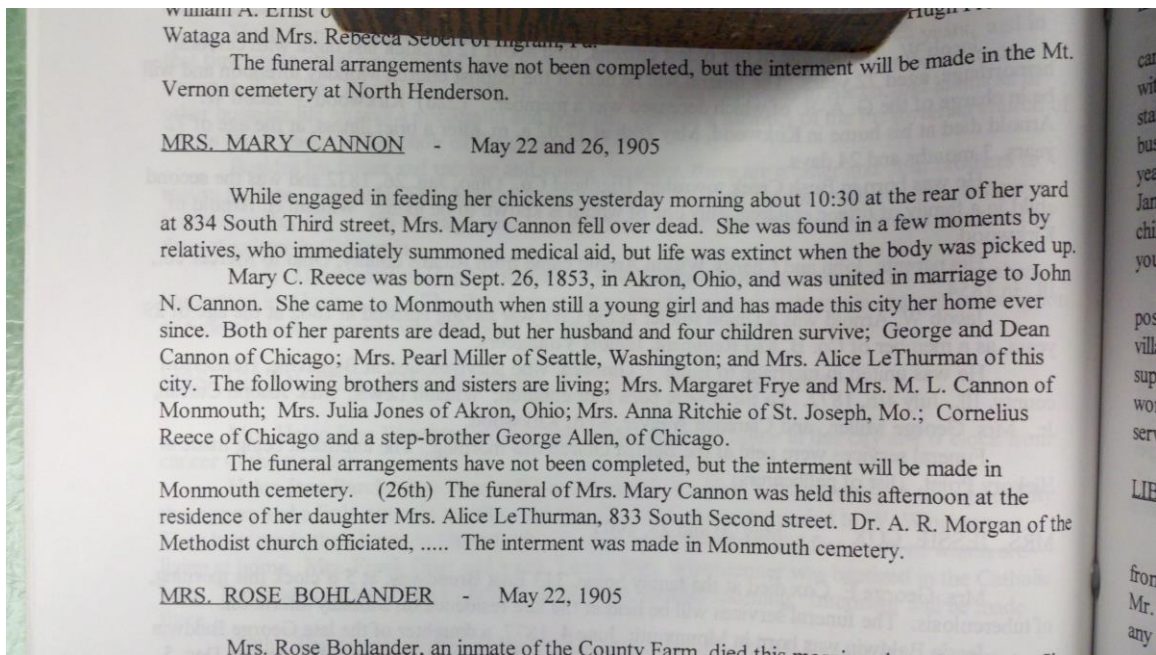
**Mrs. Mary C. Cannon.**

A close reading of the will shows that not only did Mary own her home in Monmouth, which she left to the use of her then-single children as long as they wished to use it, then to her married children if they wanted to use it or sell it and divide the proceeds between all five of her children, **she owned a lot in Chicago, which she left to Alice for her to sell.**

The will was written in 1894, at which time Alice and Emma were married (Emma was listed as Emma E. Trombly).

I notice that John wasn't mentioned: were they formally divorced?

Son George is living in their house (834 S. 3rd) following Mary's death. He has remarried. Sister Alice, however, has moved to Seattle, and has taken George's daughter Alice with her.

Alice has moved to Seattle, King, WA, living, as I said, with Alice E. Cannon, niece, who must be George's daughter.

I didn't find Dean in 1910. I found Agnes Cannon, and baby Grace P. Cannon, living in Chicago. I think that Grace was born in 1910 in Washington state, so is Dean there?


Pearl was married, living in Seattle, at 4913 39th Ave. So.

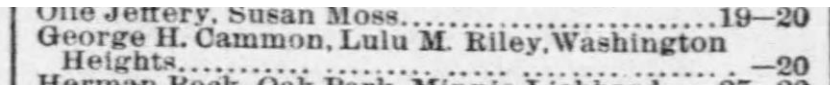

Greenwood Bandit Tells of  
Other Robberies Made to  
Finance Wedding

**J**ACK IRWIN was just a "drifter." Three weeks ago he came to Seattle from Montana with Willis West, his pal. Erwin met Alice Cannon, 8040 Sunnyside avenue, at a dance. They loved and planned to marry.

Erwin had not enough money, he told detectives Monday. He wanted to take his bride to his old home in Oklahoma. The question was how to raise the money.

On November 17 Erwin and West held up the Western States grocery, 1041 1/2 King street and obtained \$70, he confessed. The money was soon spent, so a week ago the two men planned a more ambitious robbery. They held up the Greenwood National bank and got \$2705.

Such was the story Erwin told Monday to Charles Tennant, detective chief.

After the bank holdup the two men split the money and separated. Somehow the police found out who was responsible and West was arrested when he stepped off a boat at San Francisco.

In the meantime Erwin, racing against time, knowing that the police were looking for him, took Miss Cannon to Everett and married her there.

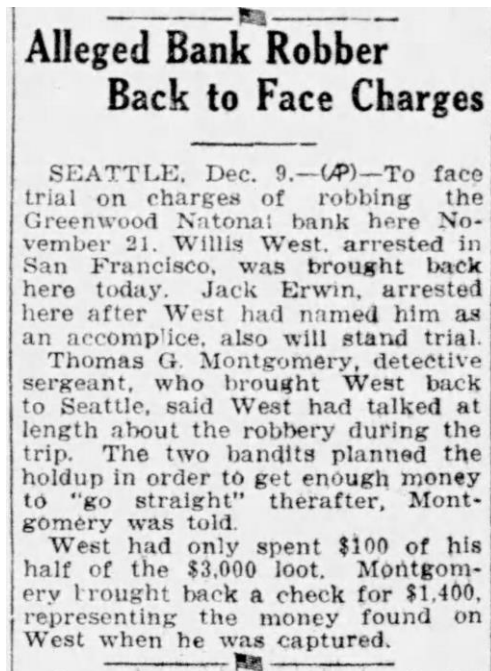
The police won, however, when they arrested Erwin a few hours after the newlyweds returned to Seattle. Saturday evening they walked into a rent-a-car garage at 1514 Terry avenue. Erwin caught sight of a waiting detective. He ran around the block, over a fence, down 25 feet into a sunken block, and finally failed from exhaustion. Detective McCarthy caught him.

The ~~bride~~ was released when she proved her innocence. Erwin cleared her when he told Tennant that he represented himself to the girl as a shoe salesman with a bright future.

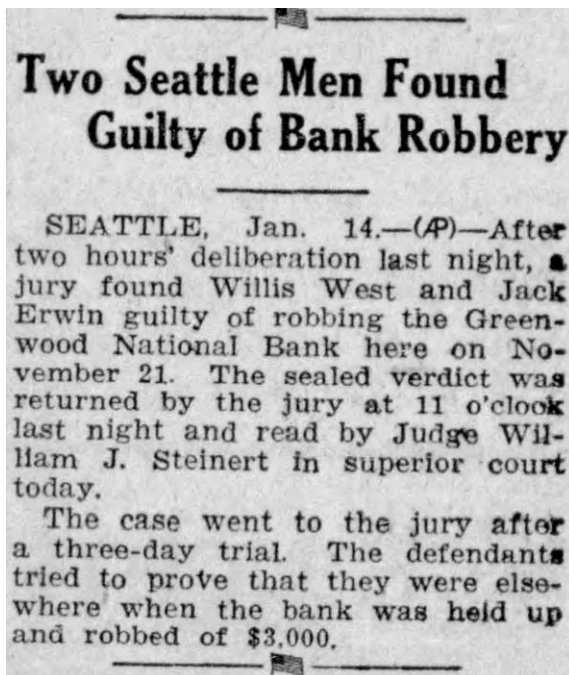

# BANK ROBBERY SUSPECTS HELD

SPOKANE, May 15.—(AP)—Arrested on a kidnaping charge, Jack Erwin, 30, and Tillie Heath, 35, were being investigated here today as suspects in connection with the robbery of the Green Lake bank at Seattle Saturday of \$4,000.

Although the couple denied they were implicated in the robbery, three Seattle officials, who arrived here this morning to return the prisoners to the coast, said there were "several angles" which they would have to investigate before they would accept Erwin's story. The officers declined to reveal what those "angles" are.

A search of luggage found in Erwin's car at the time of his arrest yesterday did not yield any clues which would connect either the man or the Heath woman to the bank robbery.

Erwin and his companion were arrested for questioning in connection with the kidnaping of a private detective in Seattle on March 21, and when Seattle police were notified, they ordered the couple held also for questioning in the bank case.

Taken into custody as they drove into the outskirts of Spokane yesterday, Jack Erwin, 32, Tillie Heath, 30, and a Mrs. Etheridge, denied any knowledge of the hold-up, but they were held for Seattle authorities. In addition, Miss Nell Julyan, 35, was arrested here on Saturday night, driving a car which had been ordered picked up in connection with the hold-up, police said.

While preparations were made to remove the three prisoners from Spokane to Seattle today, bank officials identified a picture of Erwin. Sheriff Claude G. Bannick said, as one of the two men who held the institution up.

He had been paroled from the state penitentiary at Walla Walla last year, police records showed, after serving four years of a 10 to 15-year sentence for robbing the Greenwood National bank here in 1927. In addition, Miss Heath, alias Tillie Pence, alias Marjorie Peterson, was paroled from the same institution in 1929, after serving several months of a six months to 15-year sentence for possessing stolen goods.

The arrests at Spokane followed the arrest of Miss Julyan, her lengthy questioning, and clues given by Renton police.

When the number on the bandits' car was broadcast, Renton authorities revealed that a car bearing that number was one of three that had been seen there recently, and the occupants watched as suspicious characters. Miss Julyan was arrested driving one of the cars, and the license number of the other two and the descriptions of the suspects were broadcast, resulting in their pick-up at Spokane, police said.

Erwin and Miss Heath were arrested on a specific charge of kidnaping a store detective, lodged against them here last March, but they were immediately linked with the bank hold-up, Sheriff Bannick said.

## Escaped Bandit Hunted in City

Believed to be headed toward Seattle, the scene of his bank robbing exploits, 10 and 15 years ago, Jack Erwin, 42, years old, who escaped from the Oregon state penitentiary at Salem, Ore., this morning, was being sought here today by deputy sheriffs. Erwin, who fled from the penitentiary annex where he was acting as a trustee, gained notoriety here in 1927 when he robbed the Greenwood state bank of approximately \$1200. Captured, he served four years of a 15-year sentence, being paroled in 1932. In 1933, in company of a gun moll, Tillie Heath, who also had served a term in the penitentiary, he robbed the Green Lake State bank of \$4000. Two days later they were arrested in Spokane. Paroled again, Erwin went to Portland where he staged a holdup which sent him to the Oregon penitentiary for 10 years. The woman died in prison several years ago.

## Ex-Detective's Long Memory Has Convict Back In Jail Again

Seattle—(P)—The long arm of the law embraced an escapee from the Oregon state penitentiary Tuesday night—thanks to the long memory of a former police detective.

Jack Erwin, alias John Peter Osterman, 51, was taken into custody today in a hotel lobby after a 30-minute fussle with Ernest W. Yoris the former Seattle detective chief who spotted him, and three policemen.

Police Captain Richard Mahoney said he first gave his name as Osterman and said he was from Spokane but later admitted he was the Jack Erwin who escaped from the Oregon penitentiary in 1943.

Yoris, now an airline security officer, said he saw Erwin standing in front of the Frye Hotel, and recalled he was wanted for escaping from the Oregon institution.

Yoris went to police headquarters and returned to the hotel with Mahoney and two other officers. When Erwin walked into the lobby, Yoris grabbed him. After a 30-minute struggle which started in the lobby and ended in the street, Erwin was subdued and taken to the city jail.

Mahoney said Erwin admitted escaping from the Oregon prison, where he had been sentenced for assault and robbery, but told police it "has been so long I almost forgot about it."

Erwin said he had been working in Alaska summers and living in Sandpoint, Idaho, winters.

#### MONMOUTH CEMETERY

Monmouth Cemetery is located south of US Route 34 on North Sixth Street in Monmouth, IL. It is the largest cemetery in Monmouth Township and in Warren County, IL. It dates from January 1, 1857 when the city of Monmouth, IL purchased land from Rodliff N. Allen for cemetery purposes. The original purchase was for ten (10) acres located in the northwest corner of the northeast quarter of Section 29 in Monmouth Township east of North Sixth Street limits. Subsequent purchases have been made and the cemetery presently encompasses approximately 65 acres.

The additional ground added to Monmouth Cemetery has included the seven (7) acre tract known as Glendale Cemetery. This cemetery was located east of the North Addition to Monmouth Cemetery and was laid out in 1901 by a private corporation which also erected the mausoleum now on that tract.

Monmouth Cemetery succeeded the 'Pioneer Cemetery' laid out on land donated by Daniel McNeill in the 1830's which was on the west side of North Sixth Street and north of East Archer Avenue in Monmouth, IL. The 'Pioneer Cemetery' was not sufficient to accommodate the needs of the rapidly growing city. (See "Tombstone Inscriptions, Monmouth Township, Book II, Warren County, IL" for information on 'Pioneer Cemetery'.)

The sexton's records for the Monmouth Cemetery only date from 1881 and there is no known list of earlier burials. It is thought that the first burial was in 1856 before the city actually purchased the land. Needless to say, there were probably many burials between 1857 and 1881 for which there is no existing record. Hopefully, this book will identify some of these burials and help to establish a record.

The Monmouth Cemetery itself has gently sloping hills and many stately trees. The grounds are well kept by the city. Over the years, many of the tombstones have settled into the ground, many have become unreadable due to the weather and due to the material of the stone, many are chipped and some are broken. Every effort has been made to locate and read all that was possible on each tombstone in the cemetery, but it is acknowledged that some of the tombstones were probably overlooked, and some were probably misread.

Included with this description of Monmouth Cemetery is a listing and page reference for the Maps and Sections of the various cemetery areas. It is hoped that this will be a further help should anyone want to locate any individual tombstone.

It's interesting that Emma mentions her son in her will. Curious if they ever had any real relationship. He was raised, apparently, by his father in Chicago, then moved to Washington state. Would that have been because he had Cannon relatives there?

I, Emma E. Kirk of Monmouth in the County of Warren and State of Illinois being of sound mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do therefore make, ordain, publish and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament,

First, I order and direct that my Executrix hereinafter named, pay all my just debts and funeral expenses as soon after my decease as conveniently may be.

Second, After the payment of such funeral expenses and debts, I give, devise and bequeath unto my son, Frederick L. Trombly, the following described real estate; Lot seven (7) in Block four (4) in south Addition to City of Monmouth situated in the County of Warren and State of Illinois, also the following described personal property; Piano, Lingerie, 1 parlor bedroom suit, 1 Sofa, pictures and other parlor furniture three (3) feather beds and pillows necessary, one crocheted bedspread and all the best of my quilts and bedspreads and one folding bed. In the event of my son dying without issue all my property shall revert to my mother Mary C. Cannon

Third, I give and bequeath unto my mother Mary C. Cannon, 1 bay horse named Billy.

Fourth, I further order and direct that my executrix, hereinafter named shall see as either private or public sale all the rest and residue of my personal property of whatsoever kind or wheresoever situated and that proceeds shall be given to my son Frederick L. Trombly

Fifth, I further order and direct that my executrix, hereinafter named shall have full power and control of all the above described real estate and personal property for the use of my son, Frederick L. Trombly until he attains his majority excepting the horse given my mother.

Lastly, I make, constitute and appoint Alice F. Leithman to be Executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made and that the said Executrix shall not be required to give bond as such executrix

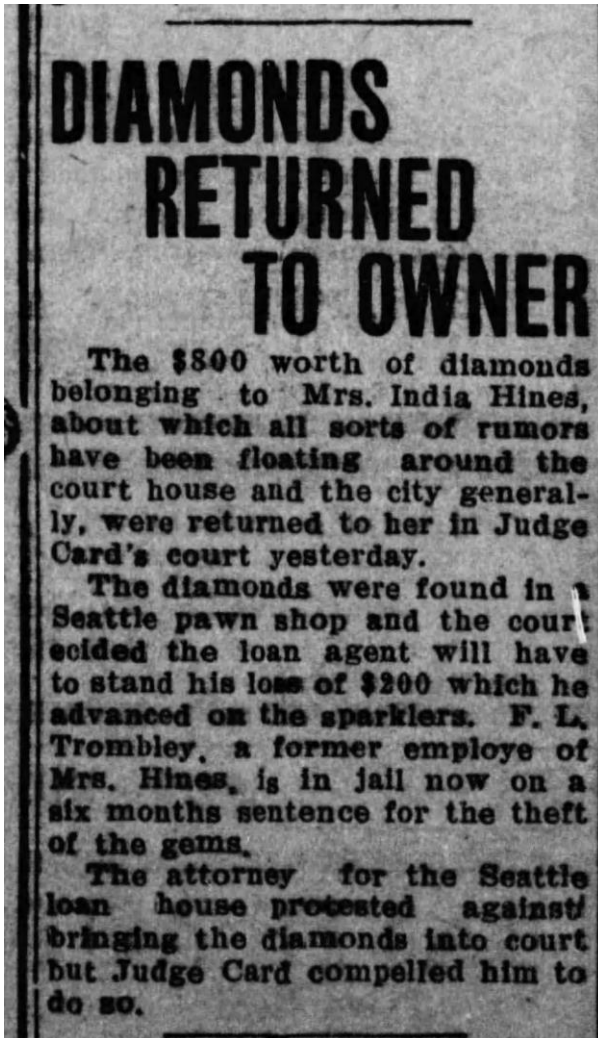

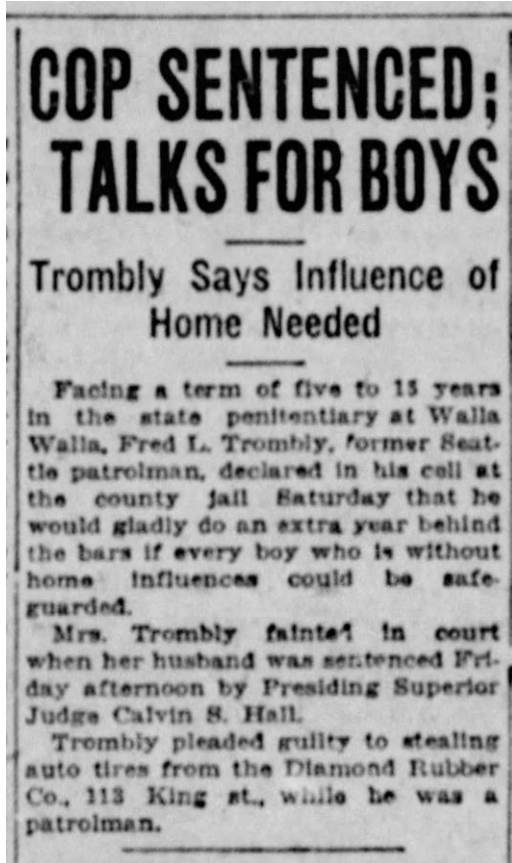

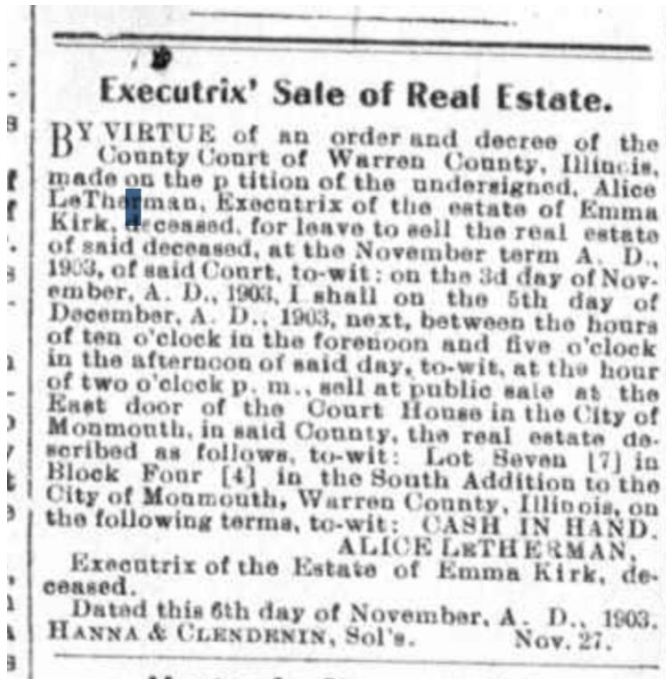

Largely as the result of a general physical and nervous breakdown, W. D. Leatherman, long a resident of this county and an extensive property holder here and elsewhere, died at the home of his father, F. M. Leatherman at Blair last Saturday morning at about 6:30 o'clock. Age, 49 years, 4 months and 12 days.

Surrounding his bedside at the hour of death were his father and mother, his wife and a brother from Ft. Worth, Texas.

The body was prepared for burial by Goodman-Floyd Undertaking Co., of this city, and on Tuesday morning it was placed aboard an east bound Frisco passenger and shipped to St. Louis for burial, which place was the home of himself and wife at the time of death. The body was accompanied by his wife and brother.

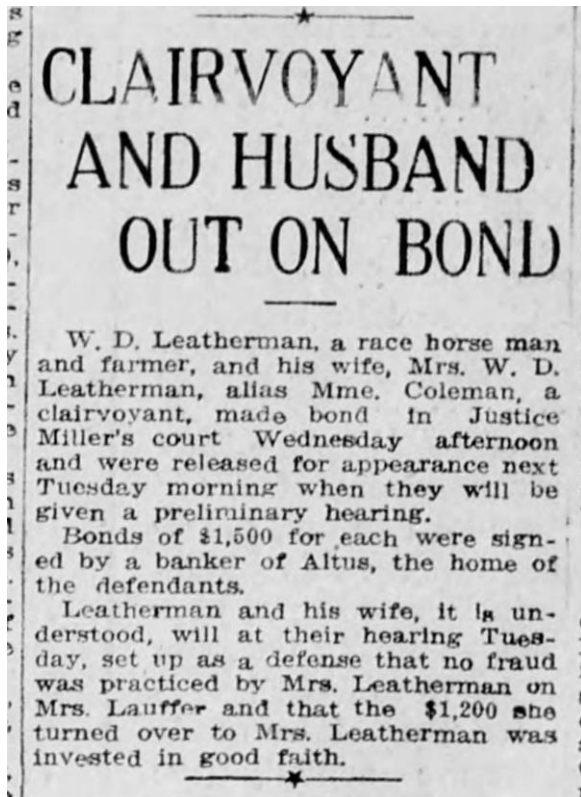
The deceased was born in Arcadia, Louisiana, and while a young man accompanied his father to this country, where he prospered from the beginning and succeeded in accumulating considerable property in Altus and Jackson county. A few years ago he moved to California where he also has property holdings. A short time past he and his wife moved to their present home in St. Louis.

His father, F. M. Leatherman, is one of the oldest and most highly respected citizens of Jackson county. He is a member of the Altus Camp No. 117, U. C. V., which body together with a host of friends and acquaintances join in his grief for his greatly beloved son.

Notice that they attribute his death to his mental state. If the newspaper articles that I found are about him, and I believe they are, he and his wife were running a scam, wherein she pretended to be a clairvoyant, and they were bilking people of their money. One of their victims found them, and they were arrested a few weeks prior to his death.

This article, a few weeks prior to his death, may explain his state of mind.

#### The first directory I found for Alice in Seattle

I found Alice's sister Pearl through the 1910's, but the first record I found for Alice, or for father John, for that matter, was 1918. In both the 1918 and 1919 directories, John was listed at the Sunnyside address. In 1919 he had the occupation of mason. No occupation listed in 1918.

Because John and Alice lived on Sunnyside before her marriage to Davidson, I have to assume that one of them owned the place, not Davidson.



Their father, John N. Cannon, committed bigamy. While married to Mary Catherine Reece Cannon, John married not once, but twice. The most recent 'wife, was Virilda Milburn Caufield Cannon.

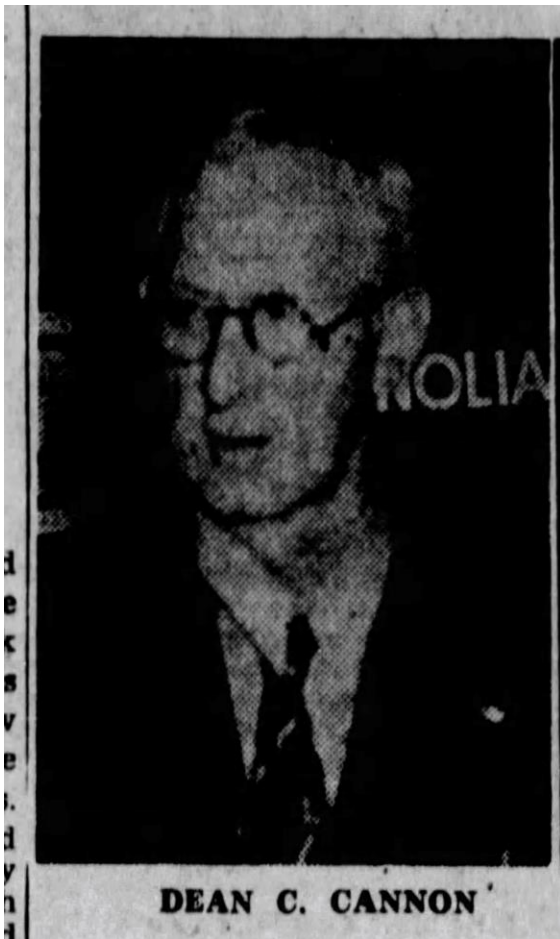
John was seriously ill with appendicitis, and either asked for his children to be notified, or Virilda took the initiative. Virilda got in touch with Dean and Alice; they brought their mother with them to St. Louis, where it became apparent that John had two wives.

Dean and Alice literally stole him from the hospital before he could be charged, and spirited him away to Chicago. Dean apparently also confiscated some of his parents' furniture that was in the newest wife's (Virilda Milburn Caufield Cannon) house. She charged him with theft and tried to have him arrested.

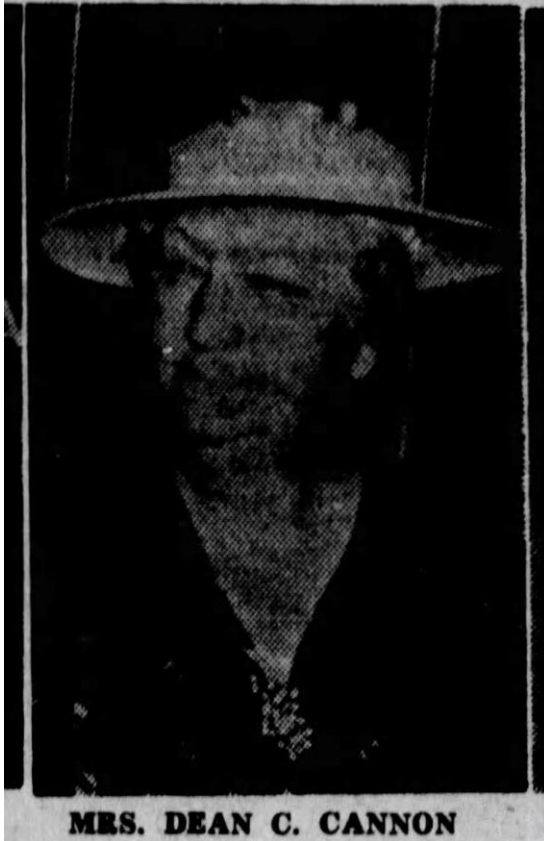
Virilda quickly had her marriage to John N. Cannon annulled.

HIS PREDICAMENT.**

**APPENDICITIS AND TWO WIVES.**

**His Latest Wife Has Sworn Out a  
Warrant for Bigamy and Charges  
His Son With Burglary.**

John Cannon, 50 years old, is in a most unenviable position. He is a patient at the Missouri Baptist Sanitarium, flat on his back unable to move. There is a deputy sheriff waiting in the ante-room to the sick chamber to arrest Cannon on a warrant for bigamy as soon as he is able to arise from his bed.

But this is not all. Cannon's son, Dean, is being sought by officers armed with a warrant charging the young man with burglary in the second degree and larceny. Worse, still, two women who claim to be Cannon's wives are alternately hammering on the door of the sick room—figuratively speaking.

Cannon has been married three times during his half century of existence. Other men have done the same thing but, Cannon, it is charged, neglected entirely to secure legal separation from Mrs. Cannon No. 1 when he led No. 2 to the altar. Fortunately for Mrs. Cannon No. 2 she died without discovering that she was second choice.

Unfortunately for Cannon, however, wife No. 3 is very much alive to the entire situation and proposes, so she says, to make Mr. Cannon unravel the tangle into which he has wooed her.

The denouement in this play of too much Mrs. Cannon came at the Baptist Sanitarium when wife No. 1 was denied admission to Cannon's room by wife No. 3, who was the widow of John Caulfield. Wife No. 1 told who she was and wife No. 3 was surprised and disturbed. Mrs. Caulfield-Cannon had been paying the bills at the Sanitarium. She quit paying and made inquiries.

Mrs. Caulfield was married to Cannon at

Mrs. Caulfield was married to Cannon at Clayton, Dec. 19, 1898. It was an elopement. The couple went to live at 1442 Clara avenue. The wife owned the house. Cannon told his wife that he had several children living at Monmouth, Ill., but did not desire that they should know of the marriage. Accordingly, secrecy was maintained. Cannon procured some furniture and put it into the house.

Several days ago Cannon became ill with appendicitis. His wife cared for him tenderly. On the advice of physicians, she had him removed to the Baptist Sanitarium. She employed a trained nurse to attend him. She spent most of her time by the bed. Cannon's condition became serious. His wife wrote to Dean Cannon, his son, whom she had never seen or communicated with before, asking that he come to his father. Dean came, and so did his mother. They went direct to the sanitarium. They were informed that Mrs. Cannon had given instructions to permit no one to enter the sick room. Just then Mrs. Cannon No. 3 appeared. Tableau!

Explanations and other things followed. Mrs. Caulfield-Cannon posted off to Clayton and swore out a warrant charging Cannon with bigamy. While she was gone, it is alleged, Dean Cannon removed the furniture from her house. When she returned and discovered the absence of her household effects she hastened to the Four Courts and swore out a warrant charging Dean Cannon with burglary. The warrants were issued Friday afternoon.

Cannon's health was greatly improved Saturday morning. He has not been informed of the war clouds that are hovering over him.

Mrs. Cannon No. 2, who was Mrs. Belle Starr Howard, is dead. Her sister, Miss Hattie Starr, lives at 2619 Pine street. Dean Cannon and his mother are living at 1811 Washington avenue.

## **MOVED FROM THE SANITARIUM.**

### **John Cannon Taken Away by His Son, Dean Cannon.**

John Cannon was removed late Saturday night by his son, Dean Cannon, from the Baptist Sanitarium, where he had been operated on for appendicitis. Young Cannon refused to tell Dr. Wilkes, Superintendent of the Sanitarium, where he intended to take his father. He only said he had discovered a quieter place.

Young Cannon has not appeared at his boarding house, at 1811 Washington avenue, since the removal, and it is supposed he is with his father.

Sheriff Pohman's deputies have been working diligently to serve the warrant, charging bigamy, against the father, and the warrant, charging burglary and larceny in the second degree, against the son, but their efforts have not yet been rewarded.

## THE MONMOUTH RE

### Too Much Cannon.

Troubles are coming thick and fast to John Cannon, who formerly lived here. He left here and finally drifted to St. Louis about thirteen years ago, and on Dec. 19, 1898, married Mrs. John Canfield, of that city. They lived together until about two weeks ago, when Mr. Cannon was taken ill with appendicitis, and taken to the Missouri Baptist sanitarium. An operation was performed, and he was thought to be dying. At his request, his first wife, Mrs. Mary Cannon, and his children, Dean and Alice, of this city, were sent for by friends. When the last Mrs. Cannon heard that her predecessor had arrived at the hospital, she became very indignant and swore out a warrant, charging her husband with bigamy. Other complications arose over some furniture owned by Mr. Cannon, while living with another wife, in Canton, Ohio, some time ago. The goods were taken possession of and shipped to Monmouth by Dean Cannon.

On account of Mr. Cannon's precarious condition the warrant was not served on him. In the meantime Mr. Cannon was spirited away from the hospital, by his children, Dean and Alice, who say that he will be ready to appear at his trial when the time comes.

On his return to Monmouth Dean gave a very thrilling account of the way in which his father was removed from the hospital. Last Saturday evening, at nine o'clock, he and his sister went to the hospital and dressed their father, who was too weak to stand. Dean then picked his father up in his arms, and carried him down three flights of stairs and around the corner, to where a rubber tired cab was waiting for them. The daughter brought up the rear of the procession, armed with a revolver, to defend her father if they should be observed. However, everything was favorable to their plans, and Mr. Cannon was taken on board the train and safely installed in a hospital, no one knows where, except his son, who refuses to disclose his father's whereabouts.

# BIGAMY IS CHARGED.

POLICE ARE STILL SEARCHING  
FOR JOHN CANNON.

BELIEVED TO BE STILL ALIVE.

Wife No. 2 Filed Several Depositions  
at Clayton—She Thinks He Is at  
Monmouth or Chicago.

Two depositions filed in the Circuit Court at Clayton bring out a new phase of the disappearance of John Cannon while he was a patient at the Missouri Baptist Sanitarium, several weeks ago.

The depositions charge Cannon with being the husband of two wives and are filed in support of the suit of the second wife, Mrs. Varilda Caufield Cannon, for a divorce.

The circumstances surrounding Cannon's disappearance, which are revealed now for the first time, are peculiar.

It seems, according to the statement of wife No. 2, that while Cannon lay ill at the sanitarium she telegraphed to his children at Monmouth, Ill., of his condition. In response to the message, the children came, bringing with them a woman whom they called mother, and who, wife No. 2 became convinced, had a claim on Cannon.

Subsequent to this, Dean Cannon, a son, called at the Sanitarium. He carried his father out in his arms and put him in a carriage, which was driven rapidly away. Many supposed that he had died, but Attorney S. C. Rogers, who represents wife No. 2, believes he is either at Monmouth or with his daughters at Chicago.

One of the depositions is made by Circuit Clerk Tourtellat of Warren County, Ill., and the other is by Martin L. Cannon, brother of John Cannon.

The evidence in both shows that Cannon was married to his first wife, Mary Cannon, in 1867, and that she is still living at Monmouth. They know nothing of a divorce.

Attorney Rogers also has evidence that there was another wife between this first

orce.

Attorney Rogers also has evidence that there was another wife between this first and the one who now sues for divorce. She was Carrie B. Cannon. She died in January, 1898, and Cannon married Mrs. Varilda Caufield of St. Louis in June of the same year. Thus he stands accused of having twice committed bigamy, but death saved him from the consequences of one alleged offense.

When the last wife became cognizant of these alleged facts, she filed suit for divorce and procured two warrants against Cannon. One charges him with taking furniture, which she claims belonged to her, from a flat at 1517 Goode avenue, and the other charges him with bigamy. These warrants are in the hands of St. Louis and St. Louis County officers.

Another remarkable feature of the case is that two of Cannon's children, by the Monmouth wife, visited at the home where Cannon and wife No. 2 were living, remaining from April 1 to April 17. This is how Mrs. Cannon No. 2 learned that he had children. When Cannon became ill, it was natural that Mrs. Cannon No. 2 should notify them. She was wholly unprepared for the revelation that followed their coming with their mother.

Mrs. Cannon No. 2 lives in West Cabanne. Attorney Rogers says she is only anxious to procure a divorce from Cannon.

"These depositions," he said, "show conclusively that he has another wife living at Monmouth. My client first heard of it when the other wife came to see him when he was ill.

"I don't believe he is dead. He was taken from the Sanitarium by his son, Dean, and is either at Monmouth or with his son at Chicago.

Cannon has five children, ranging in age from 20 to 30. The oldest child, George, lives in Chicago. The others live at Monmouth, Ill.

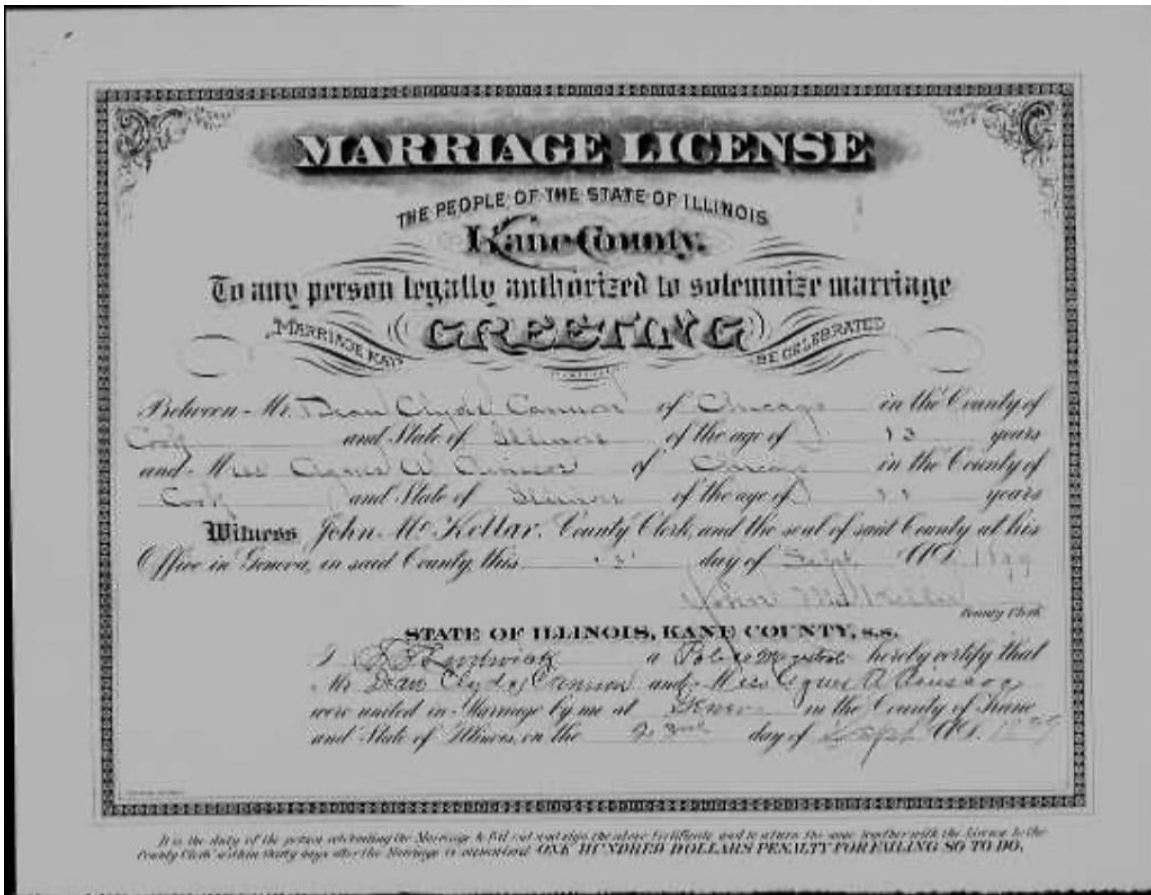

# KETCHIKAN MEN ARE ARRESTED

## Three Prominent Citizens Pinched for Circulating Seditious Literature

The Progressive Miner of Ketchikan of the date of March 21 contains the following:

A veritable bombshell exploded in the community last evening when it became known that three prominent business men of the city had been placed under arrest by the deputy U. S. marshal in connection with the distribution of the seditious pamphlet "Three in One," which went through the mail to local citizens last Tuesday. Shortly after 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon, Deputy Marshal Sharpe, having obtained sufficient evidence against the men, proceeded to arrest Frank H. Bold, part-owner of the Ketchikan Electric Laundry; Dean C. Cannon, owner of the Cannon Bakery, and Bert H. Liebe, extensive property owner. All three are American citizens, and until this time, outwardly exemplary citizens. Dean C. Cannon is a member of the Ketchikan Home Guards.

All three were ordered to appear

All three were ordered to appear at the court house at 7 o'clock last evening and were later released, under bond, bail having been placed at \$5,000 each. Their preliminary hearing will be held Saturday.

The "Three in One" was mailed in the Ketchikan postoffice in two batches, one batch was mailed at 9 a. m. Tuesday and the second batch at 4 o'clock the same afternoon. Most of the leaflets were addressed to women, a few only being addressed to men. The matter has been reported to the Postoffice Department at Washington by Postmaster Warder, who recalled all the copies he could remember of.

H. A. Dawson, who was arrested several days ago, charged with sedition and having seditious literature in his possession, is also said to have had a finger in the same pie. His trial before Commissioner Mahoney began at 3 o'clock this afternoon, just at the time of going to press.

Bold, charged with espionage, and Fremont King, foreman announced that the Grand Jury had completed its work and was ready to make out the final report.

# BANK PROMOTER IS CONVICTED AT KETCHIKAN

## Furnival Found Guilty—In- dictment Against Ryus and Cadwell Dismissed

F. J. Furnival, Ketchikan bank promoter and real estate broker, recently indicted by a Federal Grand Jury at that place for violation of the Territorial banking laws, was found guilty of the charge according to a statement made by Territorial Secretary R. J. Sommers upon his arrival here on the Steamer Northwestern. The hearing consumed all of one week, the case being hard fought. The jury was out but a short time in reaching its verdict.

Indictments returned against F. E. Ryus and S. L. Caldwell on the same charge have been dismissed. Other indictments returned were against James Bishop, Dean C. Cannon, E. J. Williams and N. F. Zimmerman. All the persons indicted were charged with violation of Section 2, Chapter 16, Session Laws of 1915, the specific charge being the filing of a false certificate and statement for the purpose of obtaining a charter for the Alaska Trust and Investment Company. The cases against Messrs Bishop, Cannon, Williams and Zimmerman were still to be heard at the time Mr. Sommers left Ketchikan. Sentence in the Furnival case had not been passed by Judge Robert W. Jennings at that time.

## DEFENDANTS IN BANK CASES AT KETCHIKAN WIN

Indictments Dismissed in  
Four Cases; Defendants  
Held Under Bonds

Four of the defendants in the Ketchikan bank cases have won in a preliminary skirmish by securing a dismissal of indictments returned against them by the Federal grand jury several weeks ago charging a violation of the Territorial Banking laws, according to a statement made by Walstein G. Smith, Territorial Treasurer, who returned to Juneau this morning on the Admiral Evans. The four men against whom indictments were dismissed are James Dixon, Dean C. Cannon, A. C. Kreistley, and E. J. Williams.

Technical grounds formed the basis for dismissal and all of the defendants were placed under bonds to await the action of the next Federal grand jury to convene at Ketchikan next fall.

Out of the eight indictments returned by the grand jury following the closing of the Ketchikan Investment & Trust Company by the Territorial Banking Board on account of alleged infraction of the Territorial Banking laws, only one remains to be disposed of, that against N. F. Zimmerman. It is unknown when it will come up for hearing. F. J. Furnival was convicted after a jury trial before Judge Robert W. Jennings while the indictments against F. E. Ryus and S. L. Caldwell were dismissed and the cases abandoned.

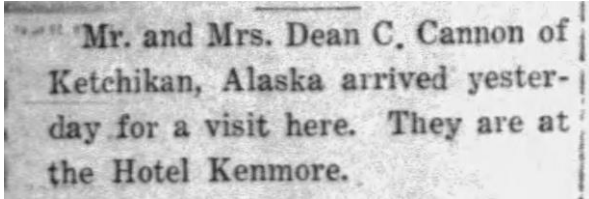

**IN KETCHIKAN**

Weather in Ketchikan, a modern city with all conveniences, is more temperate than most people think, because of the Japanese current, and rarely reaches zero in the winter months. The five or six hours of daylight in the wintertime increases, in summer months, to 22 hours . . . and it is possible to take a picture at midnight, without a flash-light.

Garden club members from all over the world go to Alaska to see the flowers and other vegetation . . . and visitors visit the salmon canneries during the six weeks they are operating. Artists like to go there at all times of the year to paint the scenery.

The Cannons and their daughter are about 5,000 miles from home and from Seattle must travel 710 miles by boat to their home. They plan to return there about May, at which time of year, they say, Alaska becomes truly beautiful.

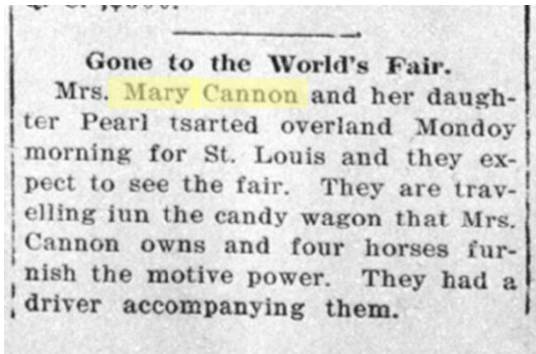
