Carl has been a challenge. His obit says that his wife died prior to his passing, yet I can't find any marriage record for him anywhere.

I found records for a Karl J. and Christine Hill Kannon in Sioux Falls, SD. They were prominent in veteran's affairs in Sioux Falls. Both held offices in their local chapter. Christine in particular wrote op eds supporting WWI vets and their rights. She had a lawsuit against a man in OK, which is what led me to understand who she was, b/c of the other names in the suit. Her parents and siblings lived in that area in OK. Her probate records gave me all the clues I needed to find her, her parents, etc. She had a son from her first marriage, which was to a physician who ran the Watson Clinic in Brookings, SD. Christine and her son lived at that clinic, she working as a receptionist, on the 1940 census. Carl lived in Brookings, SD, at least from 1954.

OK, so I know that a Karl and a Christine Kannon were residents in Sioux Falls. I have to assume that they were common-law partners, and that they took the 'K' for some personal reason, but I can't find any legal change of name. Indeed, Carl's obit doesn't reference that spelling of his name. Christine's FAG memorial doesn't mention the Kannon or Cannon at all.

Carl's census records variously say he was born in OK or MO.

Federal prohibition officials, accompanied by Marshal Fred Barnes, made a raid here shortly after noon Wednesday, which resulted in the arrest of Herman Mathes, Carl Cannon and Fred Bridgewater. Mathes is proprietor of the O. K. Garage and Cannon is employed by him. Liquor was found at Mathes' garage and at the Bridgewater home. They were taken to St. Joseph and arraigned before the United States Commissioner in federal court. It is reported they were released on bond.

It is believed the federal men were here some time last week and bought the stuff from these men and returned Wednesday to make the arrest. A patron of the garage who was there waiting for some work to be done on his car when the federal men arrived, said these men mentioned making a purchase there Saturday night.

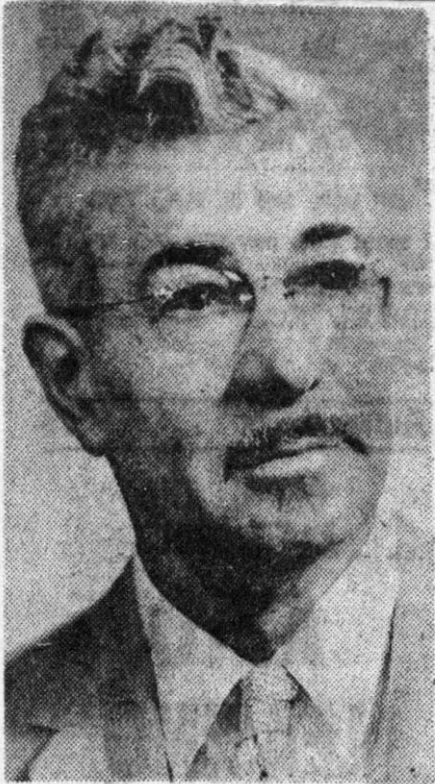

## FEDERAL COURT

A suit has been filed in U.S. District Court by Christine Hill Kannon, 1501 E. 60th St. N., against Carlos DaVila, Oklahoma City, Okla., for \$100,000 in damages. The suit alleges that the defendant has trespassed and done considerable damage to a tract of land that the defendant had no right to, since his payments had not been completed. Christine Kannon is representing herself and Richard Hasley, Oklahoma City, is representing DaVila.

## Area Dr. E. Sheldon Watson

BROOKINGS — Dr. E. Sheldon Watson, 72, director of the Watson Clinic here for 41 years, died in a hospital at San Diego, Calif., Monday.

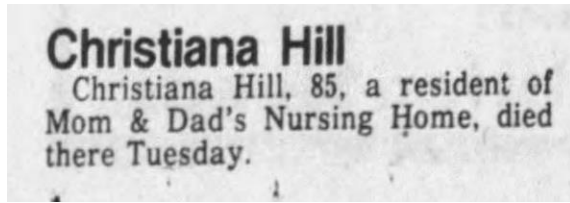
A memorial service will be at 4 p.m. Saturday at the First United Methodist Church.

Dr. Watson, born at Lusk, Wyo., Feb. 18, 1904, retired from medical practice in Brookings in 1972 and moved to San Diego. After receiving his medical degree in 1929, he practiced medicine in Lusk for a year, moved to Aberdeen and in 1931 moved to Estelline where he converted a hotel into a hospital which he operated in 1939. He then built a clinic in Brookings, which at one time had five full-time doctors and is now known as the Professional Building.

Dr. Watson was past president of the South Dakota Mental Health Association, served as president of the board of the Brookings Guidance Center for nine years and in 1964 received the outstanding achievement award from the Brookings Chamber of Commerce. He was past president of the Kiwanis Club and moderated the radio program, "Kiwanis Speech," from 1960 to 1963. Dr. Watson founded the Pastoral Counseling Institute in 1949, a joint venture of the South Dakota Mental Health Association and the University of South Dakota.

Survivors include a son, Wallace, San Diego; two grandchildren and a brother, Judson, Lusk. (Rude's)

William I haven't positively found at all. Martin Luther and John marry Reece girls (sisters) in Monmouth. Martin Luther lives the rest of his life in Monmouth, but John moved to Seattle. Martin Luther married in 1865, in which is before the death of his father. I know that Charles lived in Monmouth.

Elizabeth remained in Clark County, MO, the rest of her life. She married Moses Chewning, neighbor to where she was living in 1870. Two of her children, Theodore and Spencer, would also move to Monmouth.
