I don't have a 1900 census record for Effie, or for her brother Spencer. The census was taken a few weeks after their mother, Lizzie, died. I don't have any clue where these children may have been living at the time of the census, or for the next five years (until her marriage) in Effie's case.

Effie's future husband, Adaph Malachi Davidson, was married 5/27/1898, to Luvinnie Green, a girl under the age of 18, in Green City, Sullivan, MO. Adaph was under the age of 21, his marriage license says. Why in Sullivan County? Fathers of both parties were present, the marriage license says, and consented to their marriage. Had to get married?? I think so: I found a findagrave record for Louise Vinnie Green Davidson (2/18/1881; d. 9/5/1955, Sullivan County, MO), wife of Adaph Malachi Davidson. Her obit says

that she was mother to Nile Walter Davidson, b. 1/21/1899; d. 11/1968. That means when she married Adaph, she was probably pregnant, unless Nile was a premature baby.



Email from Dad to me re: Aunt Effie's children

Dad and his family (Maurice Emil and Letha Florence Chewning Downes, brother Roger, sister Betty Ann) would visit their Chewning relatives in Clark County, MO, about once a year. Driving from Roseville, Warren, IL, to Ashton, Clark, MO, was a big deal in the 1930s and 1940s. These trips really stood out for Dad, and we talked about who he remembered visiting, etc. His mother's people on both the Morris and Chewning side were thick in the area, so there were many people to visit. Apparently, Dad was unaware that the Cannons and Beckners were also original settlers to the area. Indeed, he didn't even know the relationships between those families and his until we started doing this genealogy together.

The following email talks about Aunt Effie's sons.

For whatever it's worth, I'm sure that Aunt Anna married Vard Webster. And I think, though I'm not certain, that aunt Effie married Adolf Davidson. I know he was Uncle Adolf to me as a very young boy when we used to visit them in Ashton, MO. As I recall, Aunt Effie had three children, all boys; the eldest always went by JD (or something like that), Hildreth, and Leland. Hildreth, so the story went, was a normal little boy, but through some illness, experienced a very high fever which left him mentally impaired. He was able to function somewhat but needed constant supervision. Leland also had a problem, a growth problem of some sort. I recall he had the biggest rather mis-shaped head I have ever seen. He was confined to a wheel chair all of his life having to be strapped in since If he leaned his head too far forward, the weight of his head would pull him right out of the chair. He was an extremely intelligent person. JD was normal, married a girl which, as a very young boy, I recall liking a lot. Can't recall her name. Took Mother over to Kahoka, MO, to visit her one time. JD had died a few years prior. And I recall, that somewhere, somehow, in the mix, two sisters married two Webster brothers. And it sticks in my mind that it was Aunt Anna's sister that was married to her husband's brother. However, you don't show any more Chewning girls and I can't recall any. And so I'm confused again. Oh well!!

I'm sure sorry to have not been of more help to you here.

Although we at times look back to the past with fond nostalgia, the Nixon Forensic Center at the Fulton State Hospital speaks to the progress made in understanding and treating mental illness since the days of the companion postcard labeled "State Hospital for the Insane." The four pillars at the entrance remain to remind us of the important role Fulton State Hospital has played over the years in addressing mental health concerns.

Did you know that the Fulton State Hospital was the first public mental health facility west of the Mississippi? In 1847, the General Assembly of Missouri enacted legislation to establish an asylum that would provide physical care for "societal lunatics" and invited counties in the center of the state to submit bids on it. Callaway County's bid of \$11,500 and 500 acres of land was declared winner of the competition.

The original three-story building contained 72 single rooms for patients plus a dining room, administrative offices and lodging for employees, all of whom were required to live on the premises. The hospital was

close to being self-sufficient: some employees and patients worked together in a farming operation that raised their food while others engaged in a variety of activities such as sewing and making soap to supply the institution's needs.

During the Civil War, the hospital was forced to close and, for a short time, served as barracks for Union soldiers. Its reopening in 1863 with 125 patients marked the beginning of a period of growth in the patient population which rose to 303 by 1870, surpassed 1,000 in 1920 and reached a high of 2,476 in 1940. Overcrowding demanded an expansion of facilities including the addition of two large wings to the original building that could house about 250 more patients, and the establishment of nine new wards plus a special unit for the criminally insane. Unfortunately, the number of doctors available to treat patients did not increase at the same pace; in the early 1930s, there was one doctor for approximately 543 patients.

In 1956, despite the efforts of fire fighters from Fulton, Mexico, Columbia, and Jefferson City, a massive fire destroyed the original main building. Onlookers pitched in to assist the staff in rescuing patients from the blaze. In the confusion, two local women were accidently locked in with the patients. When one tried to convince the staff that she was a newspaper reporter, she was dismissed as delusional. The story ended well, however. No lives were lost to the fire and both women were eventually released with quite a tale to tell! The main building could not be salvaged and was replaced by a new administrative building completed in 1958.

By the 1990s, the hospital's mission became primarily forensic, treating patients sent there through the criminal justice system. The Nixon Forensic Center, which opened on August 1, 2019, provides state-of-theart care for up to 300 patients while maintaining the highest standards of safety and security. Its innovative design has been touted as unique in the United States and continues the tradition of Fulton State Hospital at the forefront of mental health treatment
