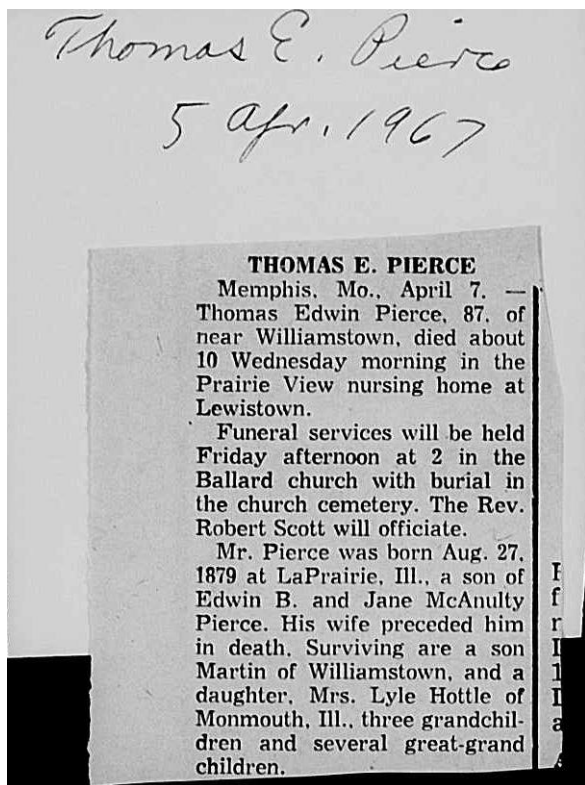

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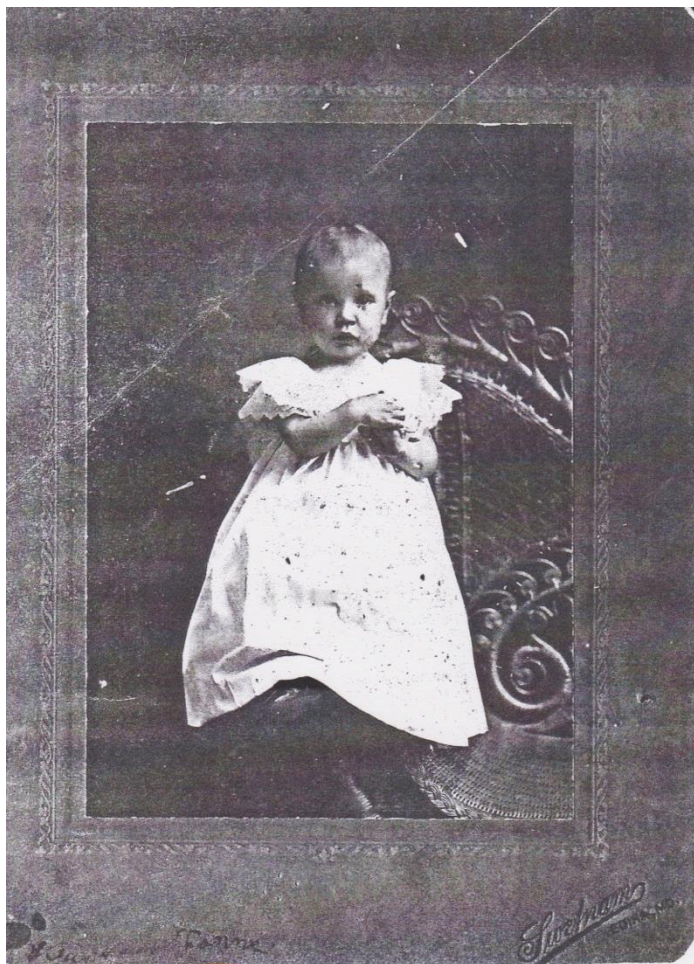

**Loren Sassen, One of Eight

GLASGOW, Jan. 5.—Loren Sassen, 18, one of eight youths who escaped from the boys' industrial school at Golden, Colo., on New Year's day after slugging an officer, was serving a term as the result of a charge of forging and passing a government check in Fort Peck in November, 1935, according to Fort Peck police records.

Sassen was one of the four fugitive youths recaptured the day after eight had fled from the school.

An Associated Press dispatch from Golden stated the eight slugged a dormitory captain, stole his keys and escaped, lightly dressed. O. A. Goetze, acting superintendent, said he feared that the boys, dressed only in shirts and overalls, might perish from exposure.

Goetze said the eight boys, apparently through a prearranged signal, leaped on the dormitory captain an hour after they had retired, beat him with a billiard cue, stole his keys and fled.

Sassen, who was living in Park Grove at the time of his arrest, was arrested with Willis Oltman, then 18, of Whitetail.

Police said their investigation showed that Oltman took a check from one of the government barracks. It was for \$24.48 and was made payable to Joe S. Hann, laborer. They stated that Sassen later cashed the check.

Sassen appeared before Judge Charles N. Pray in federal court at Great Falls in March, 1936, when he was found guilty. He was sentenced to serve two years in a reformatory and it was believed by Fort Peck officers that he was taken to Colorado for this purpose.



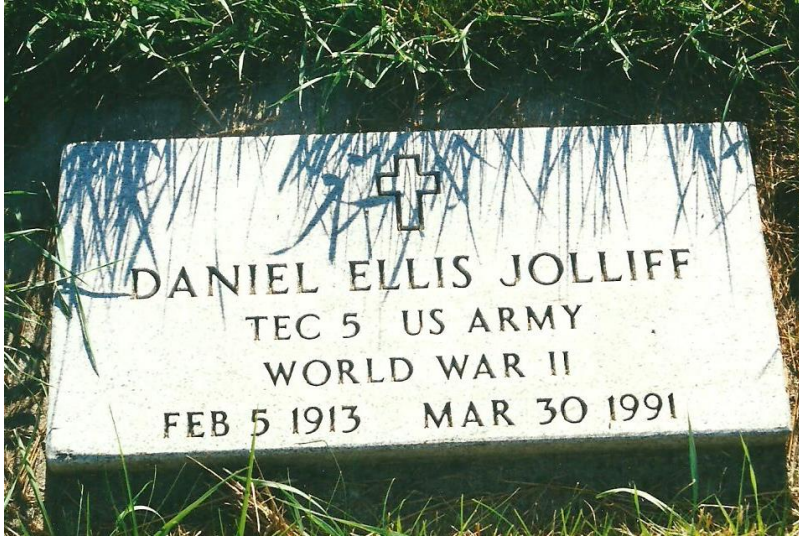

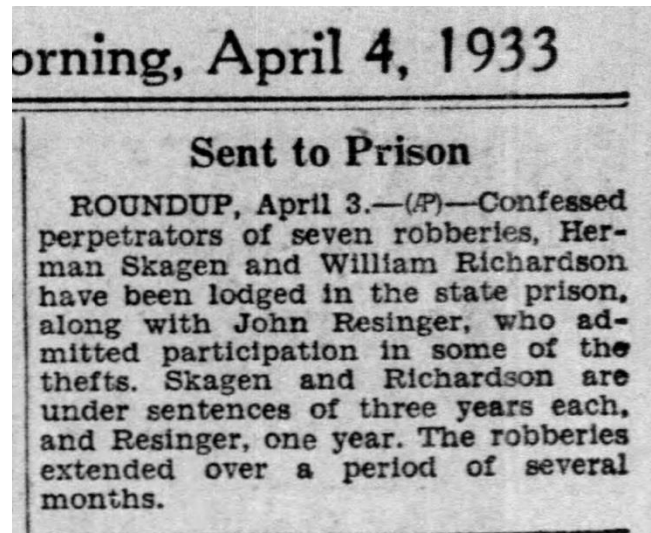

Mother of 3 Months' Old Baby Sentenced To State's Prison

BILLINGS, Feb. 11 — (AP) — Mrs. Arde Richardson, 20, of Roundup, mother of an infant daughter, was sentenced to serve 3 years in Montana state prison and fined \$10,000 today for smuggling a loaded revolver to her husband, William Richardson, 23, who this afternoon was reported as "sinking slowly" owing to a bullet wound received in an attempted jail break here Saturday.

After District Judge Ben Harwood pronounced sentence, the twice-married woman burst into sobs and was taken from the courtroom with her 3-month-old baby in her arms.

In passing sentence, Judge Harwood informed the woman that she probably would be released from state prison in half the period of the sentence on good behavior. No provision was made in the judgment for the woman to serve the fine if not paid.

She will be taken to the state prison along with Herman Skagen, 23, also of Roundup, who attempted to stage the jail break with Richardson. Skagen was sentenced to serve 13 years.

RICHARDSON MAY BE BROUGHT INTO COURT ON A STRETCHER AND ARRAIGNED THIS WEEK

Billings, March 23.—William Richardson, 23, of Roundup, who threatened to kill himself if his wife failed to smuggle a gun to him in Yellowstone county jail, may be brought into court on a stretcher the latter part of this week and arraigned on an assault charge in connection with his unsuccessful jail-break attempt.

Night and day guards have watched over Richardson since he was taken to a local hospital the night of the attempted jail-break, February 5, and later removed to Yellowstone county hospital.

His physician Monday said that the prisoner is losing ground daily but may "linger on for a year or more." The physician said that he holds no hope for Richardson's recovery from the gun wound inflicted by Jailer Lock Boyles who thwarted the attempt of Richardson and Herman Skagen to gain their freedom.

However, the physician said that he expects Richardson will be in condition to be brought into court the latter part of this week, providing further complications do not set in.

Sheriff Dan Stephenson said Monday that it is costing Yellowstone

county \$10 per day for the two guards over Richardson.

The prisoner's physician said that Richardson wants to be arraigned as soon as possible in order "to start serving time." He indicated to his physician that he would enter a plea of guilty to the assault charge.

At the time of the break, Richardson was being held in the county jail in connection with the burglary of a beer parlor at Pempels Pillar. He was arrested with Skagen and Clarence Peddicord. The trio were partners in a Roundup beer hall.

Skagen pleaded guilty to both charges following the attempted jail-break and was sentenced to serve 13 years in Montana state prison at Deer Lodge. Peddicord has pleaded guilty to the burglary charge and is being held in the county jail pending pronouncement of sentence.

Mrs. Arde Richardson, wife of the wounded prisoner, was sentenced to serve three years in the state prison and fined \$10,000 when she pleaded guilty February 11 to smuggling a loaded revolver to her husband.

Richardson is scheduled to appear before District Judge Guy C. Derry .

Searches slowed by weather

High winds and heavy snows have hampered the searches for hunters missing in the Snowy Mountains and near Townsend.

The two missing men are Dr. Charles McJilton, 77, of Helena, who is feared drowned where the Missouri River enters Canyon Ferry Lake, and Herman Skagen, 59, of Lewistown. Skagen was last seen Saturday when he and a hunting companion split up and planned to meet again at the bottom of a ridge.

Broadwater County Sheriff

Broadwater County Sheriff Malcolm Henry said boats and divers were unable to join the search for McJilton, a duck hunter missing since Monday in the delta area where the Missouri breaks into a number of swift-flowing, willow-choked channels.

In Lewistown, Fergus County Sheriff Jack Songer said snowfall in the search area for Skagen measured over a foot, and tracking dogs to be called in could not work the area, which is about 25 miles from Lewistown.

Both officials said full search operations were ready to be mounted once the weather breaks.

The searches for three hunters feared dead in Montana were bogged down by inclement weather late Thursday, while two others reported missing walked out of the wilderness and away from their predicaments.

The Chambers boy walked to safety after spending two days and two nights in the open. He had become separated from his father and a friend while hunting Tuesday in the Rock Creek Drainage between Missoula and Philipsburg.

Janzer found his way out of the Beartooth Ranch area near Holter Lake, north of Helena, about midmorning Thursday after spending Wednesday night in the open.

Authorities say the searches for the three other men have been slowed by bad weather. The three are Steve Bullock, 21, of Butte; Dr. Charles McJilton, 77, of

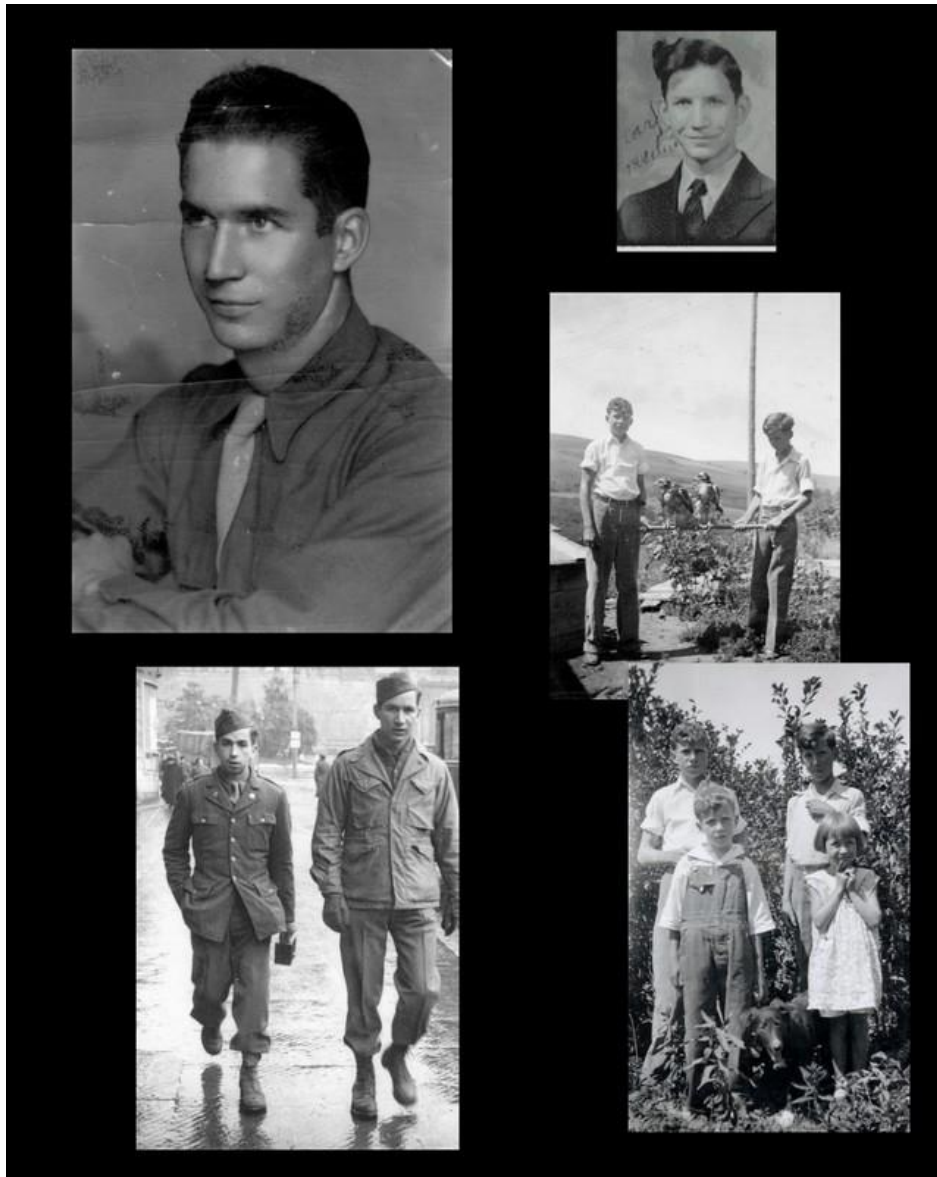

Carlyle was born May 11, 1919 in Brussett, Montana to Robert Wilford and Florence Leona (Van Wye) Martin, the second of four children. In the early thirties, his family moved to Heath, Montana where his father and brother, Donald, worked at the US Gypsum Company. He attended junior high and high school in Lewistown. Carlyle also worked at USG and retired after 35 years.

Carlyle enlisted in the Army April 17, 1942 in Missoula. He completed basic training and was sent to Fort Benning, Georgia for paratrooper training with the 82nd Airborne command. Upon completion of his training he was sent overseas, arriving in North Africa on May 10, 1943 (the day before his 24th birthday). He saw action in the following campaigns: Sicily, Naples-Foggia, Rome, Arno and the Apeninnes. He made 13 jumps with two of them behind enemy lines. He received a Purple Heart for a wound received September 13, 1943. He was honorably discharged on April 20, 1945.

Carlyle married Helen Irene Jolliff in Lewistown on April 13, 1946. For most of their marriage Carlyle and Helen made their home with their four children on Upper Spring Creek. In 1968, fulfilling a lifelong dream, they purchased an 825 acre ranch on the Judith River north of Denton. They ranched for a little over 10 years, sold the ranch, and purchased 20 acres on the Divide east of Lewistown where they built a log home and lived for about 25 years.

Carlyle loved the outdoors, hunting and fishing, good jokes, bad puns and strong coffee. There were many times when he got home in the morning from the graveyard shift at Heath, that he would put on his fishing boots and go out to get in some fly fishing on Spring Creek before breakfast. He was also an excellent gunsmith, doing work for Don's Store for many years.

Carlyle was preceded in death by his father in 1956 and his mother in 1987, and by his brothers Robert in 2003 and Donald in 1981. Carlyle is survived by his sister, Beatrice McMillian of St. Joseph, Missouri.

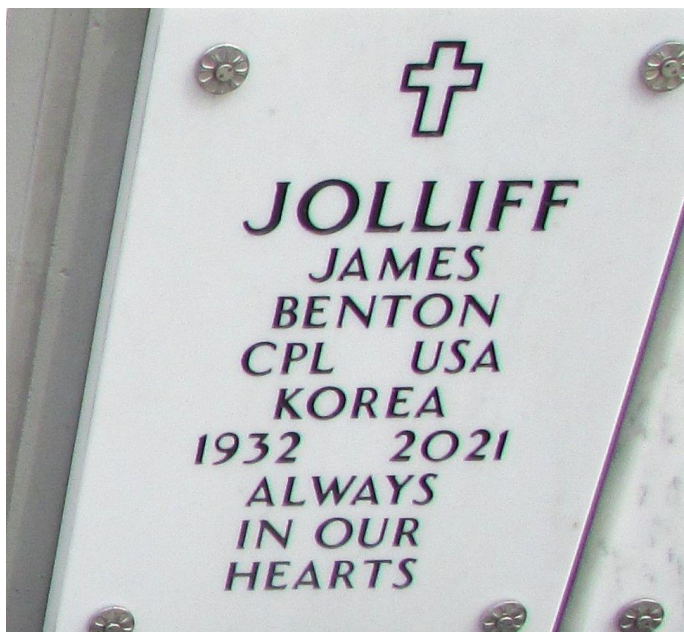

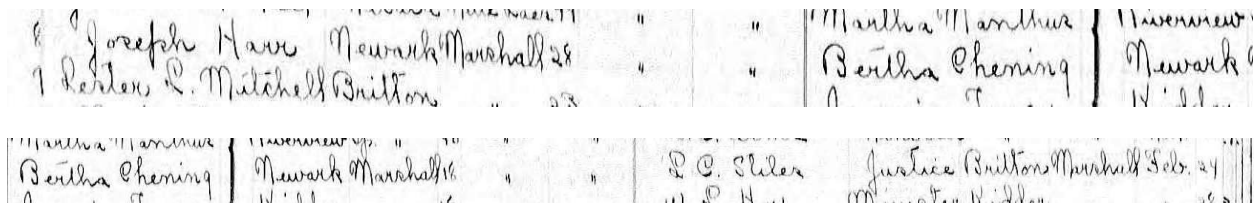
