According to a biography about George W. Beckner, published in <u>Warren County History</u>, published in the late 1886 and available online at heritagequestonline.com, AL Beckner was a native of Kentucky, being born in Fleming County in 1805? Notice discrepancy in date above. The article continues that Abram moved to Lewis, MO, in 1851, died there in September 1854. He married Miss Elizabeth Kinkaid in 1822. She was born in KY, in 1806, died March, 1856, and is buried in Bond Cemetery, just south of Greenbush, Warren County. Their son, George W., lived in Warren, IL, since 1851. Very interesting article. Notice that George W.'s wife, Deborah VanKirk Beckner's parents were also from KY. Her mother died in McDonough, IL, in 1882, and is buried in Bond Cemetery, Greenbush. One of the VanKirk's sons married Johanna Beckner, Abram's daughter.

John VanKirk's obit says that he had been in IL since 1851, which suggests that George W. Beckner and his wife, Deborarh VanKirk Beckner, John's sister, came to IL together. The VanKirk's parents came, also, so I'm presuming that George W. Beckner and family joined the VanKirk immigration, and Johanna Beckner went with her parents, Abraham L. and Elizabeth Kinkaid Beckner, to Lewis County, MO, about the same time.

Abraham L. died in Lewis County, MO, in 1854, and that is probably when Elizabeth, his widow, and some of her children, including Johanna, joined George W. Beckner in Warren County, IL.





#### Another son, Frederick/Fredie

I think the mortality schedule for Fredie VanKirk is their son. There were no VanKirks on the 1870 census for Point Pleasant Twp., and the only VanKirk family on the 1880 census was Johanna and John's. John's obit says that he fathered 9 children, but at this point I only know the names of the 5 that survived him. Fredie would be a 6<sup>th</sup> child.

John Vankirk was born in Montgomery county, Kentucky. May 15, 1822, came to Illinois in 1851; was married to Johannah Beckner of Warren county. Ill., May 15, 1854; was baptized by Elder Peter Haw, one of the pioneer preachers of the Christian church in 1841, but has been affiliated with no church since coming to Illinois. He was the father of nine children, five boys and four girls, of whom three girls and two boys survive, their mother dying Nov. 3, 1897. The subject of this sketch died Monday, Feb. 14, 1898, at 8 o'clock a. m., at the home of his son-inlaw, Albert Reed, aged 75 years and 8 months. Uncle John has always been an industrious man, honorable and just in all his dealings, was a kind father and truthful husband, well liked by all his neighbors and leaves many friends to mourn his departure. The funeral service was conducted by Elder Knight at 12 o'clock Tuesday, Feb. 15, the interment being made east of town in the Bond cemetery. A. B. C.

Mrs. C. S. Shores passed away in St. Elizabeths hospital at Lincoln last Thursday evening, a few days after an operation for gall stones. The body was brought to Utica the following day,

Mary Elizabeth VanKirk Shores was born in Warren county, Illinois, October 22, 1857; and died in Licoln, Nebraska, September 5, 1918, at the age of 60 years, 10 months and 12 days.

She was united in marriage with Clarence S. Shores on January 1, 1883. Three years later they came to Nebraska and for thirty-two years have lived in or near Utica.

When a child she became a christian and united with the Christian church and ever since has maintained her membership in that body.

Besides her husband, she is surpred by six children, four sons and two daughters, Mrs. Vince Landenberger, of Beaver Crossing; Mrs. Grace Schulz, of New York City; Lieutenant Ward Shores, of the United States army; Gail Shores, with the American Expeditionary Forces in France; Oscar Shores, of Utica; Torrence Shores of Utica. She is also survived by two sisters, Mrs. Minnie Reed, of Roseville, Illinois, who came with her husband to attend the funeral; Mrs. Alice Tate of Wichita, Kansas; two brothers, Chas. 

PROMINENT SWAN CREEK FAR-MER PASSED AWAY AT MON-MOUTH HOSPITAL THIS MORN-ING.

Albert B. Reed, well known farmer of near Swan Creek, passed away this morning at four o'clock at the local hospital. For the past fourteen weeks he had been confined in the hosspital and his death was caused from a complication of diseases.




